Island Wide Committee's Role in Seniors' Week & Premier's Tea

e were the lynchpin for the Premier's Tea along with the Cabinet Office and Public Transportation. Seniors' Week came about when the late Naomi Moore (Bermudian), arranged for BSIC's director to meet principals of the New York Area Agency on Aging to learn about their national programmes for seniors. The Island Wide Social Committee (established 1979/80 by the BSIC director) took up the idea of a national week for seniors with the Department of Community Affairs. Seniors' Week became a reality and was inaugurated by government proclamation 1986. There was zero budgeting for Seniors' Week. The Corporation of Hamilton gave the Earl Cameron Theatre (City Hall) gratis for the Awards Ceremony and refreshments were donated.

Community Affairs takeover of Boat Cruise, Picnic & Seniors' Week 1990s

eniors' Week, the Boat Cruise and Picnic were thriving community projects when taken over by the Department of Community Affairs. For nearly thirty years countless numbers of seniors were celebrated nationally before the programme was cut a few years ago.
